## **GENERAL MEETING**

The following were the main decisions made at the A.G.M. held on 9th November 2000.

- elected.
- 2 Annual membership subscription to be increased from £3 to £5. This was due mainly to the increase in the number of trophies to be engraved. Joining fee to remain at £5.
- 3 Current vacancies in membership to be offered to Brian Girling, Carl Rosner, Clive Cooper and Malcolm Goman (all previous guests who had expressed an interest in joining). Membership limit to remain at 40.
- 4 Proposed programme for 2001 to be Bletchingley (December 2000), Milford (9th March - new venue), Reigate Heath (June), West Chiltington (July - new venue) and Hoebridge (September). As regards the venue for our "27 holes - Texas Scramble Day" in May two possible courses were under consideration, Shillinglee Park and Dorking. Voting at the meeting showed no strong preferences with 10 in favour of Shillinglee and 8 supporting Dorking. Agreed that Shillinglee be the venue, unless Dorking could offer a particularly attractive financial package.
- 5 Agreed to repeat in 2001 both of the inaugural 'Short Golfing Breaks' introduced in 2000, i.e. 4day/3night visit to Etretat, France (May 2001) and a 3day/2night stay at Wensum Golf Hotel near Norwich (November 2001).
- 6 When organising the 2001 Pairs Knockout Competition it should be made clear prior to the Competition, if ladies are competing whether or not they play off the ladies card or the men's card. Once decided this decision to remain the same for every Golf Course played in every round of the competition.
- 7 Several Thank You's were recorded - particularly to John Bateson and John McDonnell for all their hard work as Treasurer and

Secretary, and to Peter Rushton our Auditor - to Barry Richards for his contribution to the Society as editor and NOTES OF THE 5TH ANNUAL publisher of the Wayfairer, and also for all his efforts in organising Wayfairer clothing and accessories. The President was also thanked for the donation of the Presidents Trophy to the Society.

# WAYFAIRER S GOLFING BREAKS IN 2001

ollowing a most successful ■ Wayfairers 3 night/4Day Golfing Break in France earlier this year, all 10 participants who went want to repeat the experience yet again in 2001 - and more Wayfairers and guests are welcome.

The proposed dates are from Monday ▲ 28th May (Spring Bank Holiday) to Thursday 31st May. Our destination as before is the Dormy House Hotel at Etretat, in Normandy some 40 miles west of Dieppe. Both the Hotel and the Golf Course are situated on the cliffs, both with superb views.

ast year everyone travelled via the ∠Eurotunnel. It was just as well as no Ferries were running due to severe spring storms! The journey from Calais to Etretat was broken by having 18 holes en route at the lovely Saint-Saens Golf Club. This is situated in the grounds of a magnificent old Chateau, which serves as the clubhouse. Saint-Saens is south of Dieppe and very close to the E402 which we will be using to reach Etretat.

We anticipate reaching our destination in the early evening in good time to settle in before our first evening meal. From the Hotel to the Golf course is just a short walk. It is entirely up to each individual how much golf they want to play in the next 2 days. Some fun competitions will be organised on a daily basis. Apart from golf there are some interesting local excursions for those who want to do a little sightseeing.

n the Thursday when we return home the plan is to book a fairly late departure from Calais (last year 9pm) to give everyone an opportunity of a further 18 holes en route. This time the plan is to play at La Belle Dune Golf Club which is just over an hours drive from Calais, and then finish the trip with some last minute shopping and a final meal together prior to crossing the Channel. The cost is not definite but based on last years prices it is anticipated to be:- £95 return for a car via Eurotunnel (to be split amongst the occupants of the car), Bed, Breakfast and evening meal varies from 365 Francs per person per day (appox £35) to 425 Francs depending on the location of the bedroom in the Hotel complex. The evening meal is excellent (ask anyone who went last year!) with a wide choice from the 200 franc menu (£20). Green fees vary from approximately £15 to £20 and obviously the more you play - the more you pay.

Other costs include petrol sharing, lunches and drinks, etc., Personal Travel Insurance will be included if drivers book their Tunnel/Ferry with 'Leisure Directions' - but note the £95 a car quoted is providing the booking is made before 24th December 2000 after this date prices increase.
