#### Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer.

All games should be played by the due dates. Failure to complete in time will result in the organiser deciding on who goes through to the next round. Only unforeseen reasons for a delay will be considered.

Venues chosen should be by mutual decision but it is the first named pairing who should make the initial approach suggesting dates and place.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to **Eddie Stanley** who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes.
