A TIGHT FINISH AT COULSDON WITH THE TOP TWO SCORES LEVEL BUT ON COUNT BACK THE VERDICT WAS GIVEN TO NEVILLE

It's been a bit of a mixed start to 2014 for the Wayfairers. Our first scheduled meeting, which was a casual day at Foxbridge in February, had to be cancelled because of the appalling weather at that time. Our 2nd gathering held very recently at Coulsdon was successful but a nightmare for the organisers as several players, all for very sound reasons, had to make late withdrawals. From an original start list of 37 this dropped way down to 32 with so many of these being very late cancellations. Ultimately 4 3Balls & 5 4Balls went out. In retrospect this could have been made into a much simpler 8 4Balls but unfortunately the changes came too late to adjust. Our 32 players did include 3 very welcome guests.

For the time of year the Course was in good condition with the greens slick, fast and frequently tricky. As appropriate for the Wayfairers the sun shone brightly all day but the easterly March wind had a distinct chill factor. Also as several members commented no matter what the position of the hole you always seemed to be playing into the wind! This was reflected to a certain extent by the average score of 26, despite the vast majority of our members all having received 2 extra shots following the October AGM. Our average at Coulsdon back in August, with members playing off 2 shots lower than currently was 28.

The winning score was 32 and this was recorded by both new member Neville Harrison & guest Robin Jelley. On count back however it was Neville who just had the edge and walked away with the Wayfairers Trophy and the John Peake Spring Trophy. Three other players were very close behind on 31.

The 3 holes for the Longest Drive & Nearest the Pin Competitions had to be rather hastily chosen and as it turned out the one selected for the Nearest the Pin contest was not really suitable, as not one of our 32 players managed to reach the green! Being the Wayfairers however this was no problem, the rules were quickly changed and Kam Wong, who was only inches away from being on was awarded the appropriate prize.

Following the meal the first raffle of the new year was held and the prize table for the day's various golf competitions was extremely full with bottles being handed out right down to 6th place in the Individual Event.

An excellent day with many members being re-united for the first time in several months.
