There was excellent turn out of 35 members for the recent gathering at West Chiltington. No guests played on this occasion which is not too surprising, as with all our members being heavily subsidised, any guest would have been paying over a third more for the day! As is our tradition every July, this was the meeting at which we played for the President's Team Trophy, a competition in which all players are split up into 4 separate teams. Usually the groups are captained by Committee members but for various good reasons they were very thin on the ground with J.McD. being the only one present - and due to a leg injury he was unable to take part!

However 4 excellent substitutes were on hand with Derek Reeves captaining the President's Party, Eddie the Match Co-Ordinator's Medley, Peter Rushton the Treasurer's Troopers while Kam took charge of the Secretary's Selection. Derek Reeves was nearly disqualified for bribing his players but a tolerant decision was made to overlook it just this once!

As the results came in the situation was tense and the lead kept changing but eventually the Match Co-ordinator's Team did just enough to emerge triumphant by scoring an average of 1 shot per player over the Secretary's contestants.

All players in the 3 losing teams had to put a £1 forfeit each in the Charity Pot and this has raised £26. Meanwhile the 9 happy members of the winning team all received a Wayfairers ball which was a fitting reward for all their skilful endeavours.

It wasn't all about teams however as the usual Individual Stableford Competition also took place. The Course looked very nice and the weather was great but there was a general consensus of opinion that the greens were terribly slow. They looked smooth, fast and firm but must have been heavily watered as no-one could seem to get up to the hole. The average score was 25 but as usual one or two members excelled themselves! Neville Harrison beat this by 10! - coming in with a great total of 35, while Derek Allen was second on 32. The scissors will be out and definitely it will be the big heavy sharp ones for Neville who also had the audacity to walk off with the Jeff Hogg 18 & Under Trophy as well!

Following the golf a really excellent meal was served. Prizes for the winners of the "Open" Draw were presented, as well as all the many others competed for on the day. Peter Rushton was thanked for standing in to do John B's usual job and eventually a most successful and extremely warm pleasant day came to an end.


