AT MILFORD T'WAS THE TREASURER'S TEAM WHO BEAT ALL THE REST WHILE SPENCER CLAIMED THE ROSE BOWL TO PROVE HE'S THE BEST!

Our Milford meeting coincided with our 5th biennial charity day. For the past 12 months we have slowly but steadily been building up our fund for Prostate Cancer UK and prior to Milford this stood at £634.50p but with lots of fund raising activities planned for later in the day, it was hoped to increase this amount significantly. It was also yet another very special occasion as we were competing for the brand new David Rose Bowl which was recently presented to us by David's family. To mark this event it was excellent to have both his son Bryen and grandson Marcus with us for the whole day, joining in with the golf as well as all the other various activities.

The day was overcast but warm as 30 members and 5 guests went out onto what was a bone dry Course. In these conditions the ball ran for miles and despite this resulting in some very unpredictable bounces the average score was a fairly high 27.

All players were split into 4 teams as one of the competitions was for the President's Team Shield. With uneven numbers in the playing groups, the final scores of each team had to be averaged and in the absence of the Treasurer his team did exceedingly well to beat the 2nd placed President's team by just half a point. (One rude comment overheard later was this only happened because the Treasurer wasn't playing but we won't mention that!) Sadly the other 2 teams trailed somewhat behind.

Guests are not permitted to win any of the Society's engraved silverware but on her first outing with the Wayfairers, Annie's friend Christine scored remarkably well coming in with 39pts. Fortunately for Tony she was in his team and this went a long way in helping them to secure the team trophy. 39 was in fact the winning score achieved also by Spencer who very narrowly beat Christine on count back. Well done Spencer - the inaugural winner of the David Rose Bowl! Spencer is having a great year. He was our winner at wet windy Cranleigh back in May and now 2 months later he has done it again, although his handicap has been reduced by a total of 7 shots in a very short space of time! Soon be single figures Spencer!

As the scores came in, an enthusiastic group gathered on the patio to see how all the teams were doing and eventually the winning group was revealed. An excellent meal was followed by the charity tombola and auction (details page 3) and then the many golf prizes were awarded to bring to an end yet another excellent day.

It's not all about Pairs Golf however, as everyone will have their own personal individual score recorded and the winner of The Wayfairers Trophy (current holder Spencer Atwell) will be determined.

Two other individual competitions are also to be contested. For the lower handicap players we have the Jeff Hogg 18 & Under Trophy up for grabs, won in 2014 by Neville Harrison. It's also opportunity time for our Golden Oldies, as they will all be competing for the 50 Bob Set which is the trophy that goes to the Wayfairer who scores the highest by adding their Stableford score to their age. Last year's champion was Ken Cooper. Can he be beaten this year? Odds are 1000 to 1 on young Damon doing this!

All the other usual minor golfing competitions will be held as well as the raffle and silver tongued Malcolm Goman will be available to persuade you to pay up with a smile!

Following the golf a Two Course Meal plus coffee will be served at approx. 5pm.

<u>OUR CHARITY DAY RESULTS</u> First thanks very much to all of you at Milford who gave their support to our final fund raising effort for Prostate Cancer UK by donating tombola prizes, buying tickets for this, bringing items to go under the hammer at the auction and to all those who then bid for them. Also a big thanks to Kam for so industriously selling all the tombola tickets and to Graham for conducting the auction as only he can do!

With all our fund raising, which started at Foxbridge way back in June 2014 and has carried on at every meeting since, we had a total of £634.50p in the kitty prior to Milford.

At Milford the tombola raised $\underline{£165}$ and all the 25 players in the 3 losing teams had to put £1 each in the pot thus adding another $\underline{£25}$. Finally the very successful auction brought in a further $\underline{£269}$ making a grand total for our Milford day of $\underline{£459}$. Truly excellent!

By adding the £459 to the £634.50p already in hand this brings our final total for the charity to £1093.50p. By twisting his arm behind his back our Treasurer has agreed to add a further £6.50p from the Society funds thus giving a FINAL TOTAL OF £1100! Arrangements will now be made with Prostate Cancer UK to hand over the cheque at some convenient date. Thank you all again and we can now look forward to our next July meeting when members will all be sponsored to play at some suitably chosen venue.


