## AT REIGATE THE SECRETARY'S TEAM TURNED UP THE HEAT WHILE PEERLESS PEER PROVED TO ALL THAT HE COULDN'T BE BEAT!

Our Reigate Hill meeting coincided with our 6th biennial charity day. For the past 15 months we have been slowly but steadily building up funds for Parkinson's UK and prior to Reigate this stood at £489 but with fund raising activities planned for later in the day it was hoped to increase this significantly.

As regards the golfing activities these were split into two sections with a variety of individual competitions organised but with the added challenge also of the annual contest between the 4 teams competing for the President's Team Trophy.

Despite being July and mid Summer the day was dull and overcast and at times a little damp but this didn't seem to dampen the spirits of the 28 members who took part, with a happy and bubbly atmosphere in the Clubhouse as the players came in and refreshed themselves.

The overall individual winner of the day was due to walk away with not only the Wayfairers Trophy but also with the much prized David Rose Bowl which was being contested for the third time. Suitably enough this was won by Peer who for many years had been a very close companion and friend of David's with them living just a few hundred yards from each other.

Peer came in with an excellent score of 37 pts and this was 12 above the average of 25. In doing so he just edged out by one point Graham Ward who recorded a very creditable 36.

As regards the Team Competition, for the past 2 years the Shield has gone to the Treasurer's Team urged on from the sidelines by a raucous Tony but this year they could only manage 3rd place. The eventual victors by the narrow margin of just 6 pts - less than one point a player with 7 in a team - was the Secretary's Selection captained by Eddie Stanley and each happy smiling member was given a Wayfairers ball as a prize for their golfing skill. The remaining, not quite so jubilant members of the 3 losing teams, all had to donate £1 into the charity pot.

One player who must get a dishonourable mention is John Benstead who frequently refers to himself as IB2. Well IB2 won not only the 19 & Over Longest Drive Competition but also the Open Longest Drive as well! Talk about greedy! From now on he is to be known as John "The Beast" Benstead!

Following the meal came the charity tombola, the charity auction and finally all the day's prize giving including the Open results with this major Championship having just concluded

#### **CHARITY DAY RESULTS**

First thanks very much to all of you at Reigate who gave their support to our final fund raising effort for Parkinsons UK by donating tombola prizes, buying tickets for this, bringing items for the auction and to all those who then bid for them. Also its big thanks to Mick for selling the tickets and to Graham for so splendidly conducting the auction.

With all our fund raising over the past months we had in hand prior to Reigate a sum of £489. Money at Reigate came in from 3 different sources - the tombola raffle at which all prizes were donated so there were no expenses and then the auction at which again every penny bid successfully was 100% profit. Finally added to this was the £1 a head which every member of the 3 losing teams had to put into the pot.

Putting all this together the day raised a total of £397.50p (close on £400). With £489 in the fund before our Reigate day and £397.50p raised on the day the final total comes to an excellent £886.50p. As it would be nice to raise this up by just over £100 to £1000 there will be a further auction at Ifield (mainly alcoholic drinks!) before we finally close the fund. Arrangements will be made with Parkinsons UK to hand over a cheque to one of their representatives at some future convenient date and it is possible that we might be able to arrange this to happen at Bletchingley on our AGM day in October.

Thank you all again. Proposals for our next charity beneficiary will be organised in Spring 2018 and next year as a positive thank you to all members we shall subsidise one (or perhaps two) of our arranged gatherings from money in the Main Fund and Raffle Fund.

<u>FOOTNOTE</u> The Wayfairers charity fund raising began in 2009 and over the years we have now reached a total of £5740 - to the nearest £1 - which has been shared by 6 beneficiaries all agreed by majority votes from the members. Can we add another £100 at Ifield?!
