2019 had already seen 3 months go through before the Wayfairers finally gathered for their first meeting of the year with the venue being Horne Park and the occasion our re-arranged AGM day.

With the meeting to be held prior to playing this ensured an early start so 9am saw 32 members collecting together from various corners of Surrey, Sussex, Kent and even Hampshire for a very happy reunion. In the efficient hands of Chairman Peter Rushton the AGM was done and dusted all in the space of less than an hour so happily the golf got underway even sooner than had been expected. (AGM notes on page 5) The 32 players set off on what was a sunny but bitterly cold day and this ensured that everyone moved swiftly and smoothly. There were no guests present but this number included 3 very welcome new members (photo page 4).

The average score for the day was 29 being much higher than in the year previous - just 24 - when the Course had been wet and heavy, although following some recent dry but windy weather the greens were bumpy and uneven and difficult to master. Despite this Bill Eslor made a name for himself by returning an excellent score of 40. His reward was to go home laden with prizes with the only drawback likely to be the expression on his face when he sees his new handicap!

Following Bill home and very close on his heels was David Smith with 39 and behind this came new member Eddie Samways with 36. They too must all face the scissors! As our Match Co-ordinator was feeling very generous prizes went also to next placed Jackie Samways & Richard Thomson who both scored 34.

The Par 3 Challenge created some excellent results. With 6 pars on the 18 holes for ages it looked likely that a very creditable 15pts would win the day but then 3 cards all recording 16 pts arrived only to be overtaken by David Smith with a massive total of 17! Must be a winner! Or so we thought! Finally the last group out emerged and among them was Derek Reeves with a truly amazing tally of 18! Well done Derek! Following the golf a warm noisy atmosphere emanated from the Clubhouse and a hearty Sunday roast meal was served and much enjoyed. Then came the time for the raffle and golf prize giving with the usual abundance of prizes. Our Treasurer was designated to hand out the goodies which he did with his usual dignity and aplomb. It seems he enjoys giving things away when he hasn't had to pay for them! And so a most enjoyable first day to our new season came to an end.

### OUR NEXT MEETING IS AT AT POULT WOOD GOLF CLUB ON MONDAY 13th MAY

This is our fourth visit to this most enjoyable Course which is very suitable for the Wayfairers and is included in our programme for the benefit of the many of our members who come from the West Kent area. Despite the Course being tree lined, tight and tricky in places, it is flat and measures just 5524 yards. For Sat Nav. the post code is TN11 9QR and the Course is in Higham Lane some 3 miles north of Tonbridge.

This is the day we play for Peer's Plate the current holder being Mike Colenutt and the winner as ever will take the Wayfairers Trophy. We shall also be doing battle for the Par 3 Champions plaque over Poult Wood's 5 Par 3 holes. In addition there will be the usual Playing Groups Team Competition plus the Nearest the Pin and 2 Longest Drive Contests. There will also be a little Charity Competition in which for a payment of £1 all players will be asked to predict the handicap of the winning player of the day. Currently handicaps vary from 8 to 36. What will your forecast be!

#### NOTES FOLLOWING THE WAYFAIRERS AGM HELD AT BLETCHINGLEY GC ON THE 12th APRIL 2019

#### **Chairman for the meeting was Peter Rushton**

Apologies received from Liz & Mike Colenutt, Spencer Atwell, Robert Crompton & Chris Wilkes **Secretary's Report** The Secretary explained that by moving the AGM date from October (17) to April (19) the report now dealt with the past 18 months and not 12. In this period 9 meetings had been held but 2 cancelled - Chartham (snow) & Cottesmore (fire!) In these 18 months it was sad to report the deaths of President Barry Richards, Richard Davison & Brian Girling plus ex members Audrey Riddles & Mike Wilson. With our Match Co-ordinator John Bateson present condolences were passed on to him from all members for the very recent tragic loss of his wife Janet. Figures were then disclosed showing that attendances per meeting over the past 18 months was down to 24 with just an average of 22 members and 2 guests per gathering. A £1000 cheque presented to Parkinson's UK had been gratefully received. On behalf of all members the Secretary thanked the following for all their work in various areas of the Society's activities over the past 18 months - John Bateson, Tony Warrilow, Derek Reeves, Sue McDonnell, Peter Rushton, Spencer Atwell, Peer Blakeley & Kam Wong.

**Treasurer's Report** The Treasurer reported a healthy balance in the funds and thanked Peter Rushton for his great assistance in preparing the accounts. He also thanked members for agreeing the financial year should now commence in April which helped him considerably in this preparation. **Match Co-ordinator's Report** John thanked all the members for their support in his very recent bereavement. Following discussion it was agreed that to avoid possible complications, the current scoring system for the Pink Ball Event should be retained. During the past 18 months no one was the day's overall winner more than once but because of some high scoring several members had received some fairly considerable handicap cuts.

**Election of Officers** All officers were re-elected en bloc.

**The Raffle** The Secretary reported the fund remained very healthy and with12 prizes on offer at each meeting and given the current average attendance of 24, this gave a very good 2 to1 chance of winning a prize! The average cost of prizes per meeting was just under £100. Members were invited to make suggestions for suitable prizes with a suggested minimum price of £5 and top price of £15. **Membership** Due to the sad loss of Richard Davison & Brian Girling membership had dropped and this been added to by the reluctant but understandable resignation of Andy Knight. However the Society was pleased to welcome new members Eddie & Jackie Samways, plus the 3 Mikes - Chapple, Pain & Taylor. The membership total now stands at 43.

**Future Programme** This had been outlined with the AGM agenda and was happily accepted by the meeting as being nicely varied, with the Courses selected suiting the differing needs and requirements of our Society. A warning was given that the very stable and bargain prices for meetings that the Committee had negotiated over the past 20+ years were rising and that members should expect a possible new maximum cost of £40 with this amount being subsidised from Main/Raffle Funds.

**Handicaps** Following a review of results over the past 18 months it seemed that the current Handicap system resulted in fairness to all members and there was no necessity to make any changes. It was agreed that for our unique system the maximum any player should receive should stay at 36 with anything higher than this likely to cause complications in compiling score card results.

**Pairs K.O. Competition** In Spencer's absence he was thanked for yet again running the KO Pairs Contest. With a minimum requirement of 8 pairs it looked as though the competition was in danger of being undersubscribed but despite ill health Peer announced that he had revised a recent decision to withdraw so the annual battle continues with regular updates to be made on progress.

**Wayfairers Web Site**. Derek reported a slight increase in the cost of running the Web Site in order to ensure security. Members experiencing any difficulties in use of the site were requested to contact him. He was warmly thanked for organising such an excellent & informative service.

**A.O.B.** With the recent loss of lifetime President Barry Richards it was agreed following some discussion that a new President should not be appointed. It was also agreed that a ball coming to rest in a footprint in a bunker should not gain any relief but be played "as it lies" thus removing any likely problems with interpretation of the rule. Jeff Hogg's suggestion of a Memorial Trophy bearing names of past members was raised and it was left to the Committee to discuss and recommend any future action. Peter Rushton was thanked warmly for taking the chair and so the AGM ended and it was time for the golf to begin.
