18 players in 5 groups set off from the first tee with the course, which seems to improve more and more from year to year, looking lush and green. Despite this being a short lay out with 6 par 3's the scoring was not that high with the average for the day registering at 26.

In comparison with our recent Ifield visit, the average for the day there on a much longer course was 29. However while at Ifield the greens were lightning fast, at Villa all putts had to be very firmly struck resulting in many a 3 putt or worse as so often the ball failed to reach the hole.

Some 9 months have passed since members were requested to renew their membership and at this time we gained one new member Terry King who had played with us as a guest on previous occasions. This time of course coincided with the start of the coronavirus epic and since then it has only been possible to have one meeting, this being our September gathering at Ifield for which Terry was not available.

So after three quarters of a year as a member, Terry finally got to play at Villa and became an immediate winner with 33pts. No way for a new member to behave! Now sit back and watch your handicap disintegrate Terry! 33pts just pipped Kam by 1pt who finished with 32 which was exactly the same score he had recorded at Ifield, where once again he finished runner up. Always the bridesmaid Kam - never the bride - but well played. Another shot gone!

It should also be noted that Chris Wilkes was just 1pt less than Kam on 31, which means that 2 of our lowest handicap players - Kam off 9 and Chris off 12 - finished in the top 4 proving that quality really counts. Due to all the current on-going coronavirus restrictions it was impossible to have speeches or official presentations, so the awards were all money prizes dispensed with little ceremony.

This was a bottle put away months ago for a Par 3 Challenge contest which has never happened and was instead presented to the player who was nearest the pin in 2 on the long par 3 11th hole. The clear winner was Kam whose shot finished on the edge of the green with his consequent birdie attempt just inches short! Well done Kam.

After play the Autumn weather was good enough for all to all sit outside in playing groups. And so a rather unusual but nevertheless enjoyable Wayfairers day came to a conclusion.
