Prior to going out many members commented very favourably on the reception received from the Club with the early presentation of what was commented on as probably the very best bacon bap served up in our many years of existence! Sadly it was an occasion without 2 key committee members as both our Match Day Co-ordinator John Bateson was returning from holiday and our Secretary had to withdraw very late with ill health problems. However Treasurer Kam proved just what a treasure he really is as he took on the day's responsibilities single handed but as a regrettable consequence, for the second consecutive time no raffle could be held as the raffle organiser vet again was not present. Out on an unknown Course the players commented on an excellent lay out spoilt only by slow greens possibly not cut over a busy weekend. As 3 putts were the order of the day perhaps there should have been a new prize for the overall champion 3 putter! Despite all this the scores recorded reflected a very close contest with so many players tightly bunched together and with a high average of 30 pts per player. Overall an extremely close high scoring contest. Eventually it was Storming Norman who claimed all the honours and top prizes with an excellent total of 39pts. Added to this our golf prize purchaser John B. had made the top prize a bottle of port! Norman was ecstatic but won't be when he sees his new handicap! Close behind Norman was Eddie on 38 and then came 3 players on 37, 36 & 35 - so close! Shows how well the handicap system works! Following the golf and most welcome refreshments, an excellent meal was served and members were full of praise for the service of the staff on what was a most enjoyable day. A venue to which many members said they would happily like to return - albeit with faster greens!

AND SO TO OUR NEXT MEETING THIS IS AT CHERRY LODGE ON MONDAY 11th JULY

Once again a new venue for the Wayfairers but a prestigious and probably one of the best venues we shall be visiting in 2022.

LOCATION the Golf Club is situated in Jail Lane (quite appropriate for some of our members!) and this is almost mid-way between Westerham & Biggin Hill with Jail Lane and the Golf Club running off to the right of the A233 heading northwards from Westerham to Biggin Hill. The Club indicates it is within 5 miles of Westerham. THE COURSE is not short - 6142 yards for the men (par 72) and 5611 for the ladies (par 73) and buggies may well be advisable for some members. Should you require a buggy please inform J. McD NOW - so that we can then ensure sufficient are provisionally booked very early on.

This is the day we will be competing for the much coveted Peer's Plate kindly donated by Peer Blakeley several years ago. With this goes the Wayfairers Shield and numerous other prizes for runners up. There will also be a playing groups team competition plus the usual Nearest the Pin and 2 Longest Drive Contests.

On arrival there will be coffee or tea and following the 18 holes golf there is a 2 Course Meal also supplemented with tea or coffee. On this particular occasion all prizes will be purchased using money from a raffle and/or main fund subsidy.

COST After some lengthy negotiation with the Club we managed to get the cost per player for all this from an advertised price of £64 down to £50. A real bargain when considering the green fee alone for 18 holes is £35. At our recent AGM it was agreed that with increasing costs we should be looking at a maximum of £50 or close to this for any of our packages and we can assure our members that Cherry Lodge will be the most expensive day of any that we hold this year. Hopefully afterwards everyone will agree it was all well worth it.

PAYMENT If you do intend to play please let Kam have your £50 by **FRIDAY 17th JUNE**. Reminders will be sent out nearer the time to all those not already paid. Please note for your organisers it is just as important that we know if you are not available as if you are, so if this is the case please let us know ASAP. You can inform John McD or Kam.
