



Wayfairers handicaps current at the time of playing are to be used and confirmation of handicaps can be obtained from John Bateson (01342 832602). Handicaps at 24th July are shown above. Ladies to play off Ladies Tee and play to Ladies Card and stroke index.

On completion of each match the results are to be notified promptly to John Bateson by the winning Team who, when it has been decided, will be told who they are playing in the next round.

HANDICAP ADJUSTMENTS WILL BE MADE AS THE COMPETITION PROCEEDS.

HANDICAPPING SYSTEM

Just a reminder - the lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receive strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes.

SOCIETY CHAMPIONSHIP
