

WAYFAIRERS GOLF **SOCIETY** NOTES OF THE 6TH ANNUAL GENERAL **MEETING**

The following were the main decisions made at the A.G.M. held on 9th November 2001

: 4------

1 All existing Officers were re-elected. 2 Annual membership subscription to remain at £5. Joining fee to remain at £5. 3 The full programme for 2002 as described in the September issue of the Wayfairer was approved. A request to return to Shillinglee at some future date received little support. The policy of attempting to plan and book a whole years programme in advance received majority approval (15 votes for - 5 against). The Secretary stated that the chances of exploring further new venues was becoming more and more limited as 20 different courses had now been played, thus almost exhausting the possibility of finding further clubs in our geographical area within our price range.

4 As it was likely that some members who had played very infrequently would not be renewing their membership, it was agreed that new membership should be offered to the few currently on the waiting list. If after this, there are still vacancies, any attempts to fill these should not include, for the time being, any invitations to Holtye Members, as this would be likely to create an imbalance in the composition of our Wayfairers Membership. It was stressed that invitations should only be made to players likely to fit in with the ethos of our Society.

5 A table showing handicaps, scores and averages throughout the year was presented to each member. This produced a lively discussion with the fairness of handicaps over 28 being questioned, particularly in relation to the four ball better ball competition. However an examination of the scores and results indicate that our present system gave everyone a fair chance and produced some very close and competitive matches. Chiddingfold was won off a handicap of 11 and the knock-out finalists played off 11, 13, 17 & 18.

The overall average score for the year was 29.48 with individual averages ranging between 26.57 and 33.50. Our two highest handicappers averaged 30.00 & 29.00 and our lowest single figure players recorded 33.50 and 32.00. The closeness of these results supports our current arrangements. The interest and discussion was welcomed even though the decision was to continue with our present system
