



NOTES OF THE 7TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The following were the main decisions made at the AGM held on 5th November 2002.

- 1. All existing officers were re-elected.
- 2. Annual membership subscriptions to remain at £5. Joining fee to remain at £5. A suggestion that on the Treasurer's Annual Balance Sheet the number of players participating at each meeting should be recorded was not considered to be appropriate.
- 3. The meeting was in favour of continuing planning a years programme in advance, and the programme for the next year was accepted without any additional comment from those present.
- 4. It was agreed that membership of the Wayfairers should not exceed the present limit of 40, but 2 vacancies currently available should be offered to Bob Histed and Ann Hitam who were at the top of the waiting list. This would leave Robert Bissett and Don Jessop as next in line, with the possibility that one or two vacancies might occur when annual renewal application forms are issued.
- 5. The Secretary reported that 2 Golf Breaks had now been organised for 2003. Currently 14 Wayfairers are going to Wensum, near Norwich in late February for a 2 night break and there were still rooms available for anyone interested. In late May, 16 Wayfairers were booked for a 3 night stay at Hardelot in France but there were no further spaces available on this venture. Members were reminded that anyone who has suggestions for future Golfing Breaks should contact the Committee with their proposals which could then be put to the rest of the membership.
- 6. It was agreed that the ladies handicaps could be extended to a maximum of 45 shots. It was considered to be too unwieldy to publish a full list of members current handicaps in every issue of the Wayfairer. Anyone wishing to know of any changes to their handicap, or any other Wayfairers handicaps as a result of their scores at the previous meeting should contact John Bateson direct. This particular item was raised in relation to the on going Pairs Knockout Competition.
- 7. It was agreed that for the Holtye Meeting in May (27 holes) the Texas Scramble should be played over 18 holes pm instead of 9 holes am. Should it be possible to use the 9 hole pitch and putt course at West Chiltington at no extra cost, the Committee should organise a fun competition to be played either before or after the main 18 hole event. Two possible suggestion for this extra contest were a 2 club + putter Individual Competition or a pairs Texas Scramble.
- 8. At various stages of the meeting thanks for all their work on behalf of the Wayfairers were extended to John Bateson, John McDonnell, Barry Richards, Peter Rushton & Ron Harris
