#### WEST CHILTINGTON GOLF CLUB

#### **MONDAY 21st JULY**

This will be our 3rd visit to West Chiltington but please note we have an earlier starting time this year. Coffee will be available from 9.15 am with the first Group teeing off at **10.00am**. 3 Course Evening Meal at approximately 5.30pm.

We are starting earlier because we have added to the day's programme. As well as our usual 18 Hole "3 Way Team Challenge" and joint Individual Stableford Competitions, we have negotiated use of the 9 Hole par 3 Course. For those who wish to participate this will be the venue for an additional Competition, taking the form of a "2 Club Only" (plus putter) Event. Players will have to nominate on the 1st Tee just what 2 clubs they will use from tee to green for the duration of the round - and stick to these! To take part in this extra event, there is an additional £1 added to your day's entry fee to cover the expenses of running the Competition. Entry is completely voluntary, and if you want to spend more time just relaxing on the terrace it's up to you! When you play is also your choice. It can be before or after the main 18 Hole Event. Obviously your decision will be influenced by your Main Course start time, so you

may wish to check this out with either of the 2 Johns the day before. You will need someone to play with in order to mark your card. Play in 2 Balls or 3 Balls, but not 4 as this may slow down the progress of the Competition and remember we eat at 5.30! Please also note we have no teetime bookings on the Short Course - just turn up and play. As ever the main Event will be The President's Team v. The Treasurer's v. The Secretary's. Last year the President's Players emerged as the victors, but as the results were so close we will if possible put people in the same Teams as before, and newcomers will be allocated vacant slots as available to make up even groupings. The winning Team will be awarded the President's Trophy, which hopefully each member can hold for a few weeks during the next year, and these players will also receive a Wayfairers Golf Ball to mark their glorious achievement!
