

Tt had been reported (and subsequently Lagreed by the team) that on an early hole their Pink Ball had been hit into a hedge and a provisional ball had been played. All would have been well if, when the Pink Ball was found, it had been played, instead of play continuing with the provisional ball, which then became the 'Ball in Play.

The ruling was that the found Pink ■ Ball, having been kept safe in Jeff,s pocket, could not be put back into play at the next hole even though it was not technically 'lost'. Any other ruling would have meant that on any 'dangerous' hole Pink Ball could have been Society Championship as he safeguarded by taking similar action, or improved his score from 108 to 112, put back into play at any time should a equalling Dennis Shelley's previous lost ball be later found.
