


Nearest the Pin - Don Woollard

Advance Warning! No matter where we go at this time of the year it is likely that there could be a Trolley Ban. You might like to check this for Chiddingfold as well.



Now here is an offer you can't refuse! Should you not enjoy the evening your money may be refunded in full!!




Wayfairers Golf Society Notes of the 3rd Annual General Meeting Held on 6 November 1998

The following were the main issues discussed and agreed:-

- 1) All existing Officers were re-elected.
- Both the Secretary's & Treasurer's report were accepted by the meeting with votes of thanks by all present.
- 3) It was agreed that our membership limit be increased to 40 with this number being a definite final maximum. It was further agreed that any member who does not participate at any of the Wayfairers gatherings for a period of one year (Nov. to Nov.), unless there are exceptional circumstances, should not be invited to renew their membership, and any member who does not appear at least twice in the same period of time shall be requested to consider relinquishing their membership to the top person on the "waiting list", and instead become an "occasional guest".
- 4) It was agreed that the proposed programme of meetings for 1999 be accepted, with the Officers being given the task of ensuring that at least one new venue be incorporated, and that "value for money" be a high priority when choosing between two or more possible venues for any one particular meeting. Agreed to hold 7 meetings in the forthcoming year.

- 5) With a sum of £158.13p in hand following the Chiddingfold raffle it was agreed that as soon as this amount rose to £170 the money be spent on purchasing golf balls incorporating the Wayfairers logo. Also agreed that one major raffle prize be purchased for each meeting to go with the other subsidiary prizes.
- 6) It was agreed that an "Identities" clothing & accessories catalogue should gradually be circulated around all the members (only got one copy) to give them an opportunity if they so wish to purchase clothing and/or articles incorporating the Wayfairers Logo. A minimum number of 12 separate purchases are required by "Identities" in order to make setting up the screen worthwhile. Positively no orders to be given to "Identities" until members are notified of what would be the exact cost of their likely purchase(s). Cost of a minimum number of Wayfairers ties (12) also to be investigated with a report back to members.
- 7) It was agreed that 2 identical golf figurine trophies (kindly presented by Jeff Hogg & mounted by Chris Wilkes) should be played for on a Pairs (4 Ball Better Ball) Matchplay Knock-out basis with further details to follow to all members.
