# JUBILANT JAN SHOWED THE REST HOW TO PLAY AS SPRING SPRANG AT GATTON ON SPRING CUP MEETING DAY!

The Wayfairers 3rd annual visit to Gatton Manor coincided with a glorious Spring day much enjoyed by 38 members and 3 guests, as they all joined in battle to compete for the John Peake Spring Cup.

The Course was in excellent condition, although the steeply contoured greens gave much cause for alarm! Be positioned just inches above the hole, but miss it at as your putt trickled past, and then watch your ball pick up speed as it continued to roll and finish some 20 or 30 feet down the slope - the devastating experience of so many! This factor, combined with very tight lies on the short mown fairways, gave an end result of some very low scoring. Out of 41 players, only 6 recorded 30 or more, with 14 all coming in with less than 20pts! The average score of the day was just 22pts - very close to an all time low! Never in the history of the Wayfairers have so many players come in off the Course in the certain knowledge that they have won the Hedgehog, only to find that their hopes have been dashed!

In top place on the final results sheet was the smallest player in the field - effervescent Jan Henshaw, who somehow mastered most of the difficulties to come in with a most creditable score of 36pts - including 4 blobs! One of the raffle prizes was a donated pair of secateurs - most useful to cut that handicap of yours Jan! In second place, just 2pts behind was Mike Colenutt. Mike hasn't been a member for long (and his current handicap won't last much longer either! Ed).

Andy Knight was another star of the day showing both brain & brawn! Against some very stiff opposition he was the winner of the Open Longest Drive, and then he proved the delicacy of his shots by winning Harold's 18th Hole Trophy - nearest the pin in 3.

The Team Prize (4 superb vintage bottles of wine) was won very narrowly by just one point thanks to the combined skill of Jan, Spencer, Malcolm and his guest son Richard who squeezed out Chris, Jeff, Frank & Peter Storey into second place - for which there was no prize - just glory (and recriminations! Ed)

At the meal President Barry was welcomed back after a very long enforced absence, and John B. was sent everyone's best wishes for a speedy recovery for his return to the first tee. Having consumed their hospitality both before and during the meal, everyone was in good voice to wish Mike Riddles a very belated happy 80th birthday, and to congratulate Dennis Shelley on his recent rise to the elevated status of State Pensioner!

And so ended a truly pleasant Spring day.

#### AND SO OUR NEXT MEETING TO BE HELD AT CRANLEIGH GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB ON TUESDAY 5th MAY

For many years our early May gathering has been held at Holtye, but as Holtye is probably the best Course that we visit for remaining open in severe weather conditions, this venue has now been booked for our Christmas meeting on Friday 11th December. Holtye in May also used to be the only gathering at which we played more than 18 holes, but by a majority vote a limit of 18 holes only was agreed at our last AGM.

So 18 holes it is at Cranleigh G.C. - a venue that will be new to many, but has been visited by the Wayfairers in March 1997 and again in March 2004. Due to circumstances beyond our control the day will be slightly different to usual. Currently Cranleigh is undergoing a £3 million renovation to its beautiful but very ancient timbered Clubhouse. Because of this all facilities are somewhat limited and in portakabins. The 18 hole Golf Course however appeared to be in excellent condition when a brief visit was made recently. Any member wanting a reduced rate voucher (£17 not £20) for a preliminary visit to Cranleigh before our day please contact John McD.

The programme is to gather on Tuesday 5th May from 09.10 for coffee & biscuits. These will be served in a portakabin, so if everyone arrives at once, it should be very friendly! We have 2 tees booked, with some playing groups starting on the 14th at 09.50 and the remainder on the 1st at 10.00.

Following the golf it is entirely up to members whether or not they wish to shower and change. Adjacent portakabins do have showering and changing facilities.

Doubtless you will be pleased to learn that dinner is <u>not</u> in a portakabin! When players are ready they return to their cars and drive to the Bulls Head at nearby Ewhurst which is about one mile from the Golf Club. This is a very pleasant friendly pub with a lovely garden. In the pub we have our own private dining room complete with bar for our exclusive use. A 2 Course meal with coffee will be served at approx. 5.15pm. followed by the usual prize giving.

And what is the price for all this? PAYMENT Total cost for coffee & biscuits, 18 holes. a 2 Course meal with coffee plus all prizes is just £34. A real bargain for this time of the year. Also at no extra cost, before dinner and in the garden Treasurer Tony will entertain all with a masterful display of the ancient art of falconry! Not to be missed! COMPETITIONS At Cranleigh we will as always be playing individually for the Wayfairers Trophy (now held by Jan Henshaw). As we have no other Trophy to go with this which can be played for annually, Peer Blakeley has very kindly and generously rectified this situation. At Gatton Manor he produced a beautiful silver salver which has been engraved as "Peer's Plate". This will go to the winner of our May Competition every year to be held for 12 months. Also for this inaugural competition, Peer has donated an excellent commemorative clock which the first winner of his salver will get to keep. A lovely prize Peer, and many thanks from all of us for this most generous gesture. Also at Cranleigh there will be the usual Team Competition plus all the other varied contests of golfing skill (or luck! Ed)

DIRECTIONS to Cranleigh G.C. There are many varying routes but all a little complicated. Probably the majority of our members will be travelling from an easterly direction. For them get on to the A281 (Horsham to Guildford road) at Broadbridge Heath. Go along the A281 and come off at the roundabout joining up with the A29 heading north up to Dorking. Proceed up the A29, but within a very short distance from the roundabout take the very first turn off to the left (possibly signposted Ewhurst? Ewhurst Green? Walliswood? or even Cranleigh? Whatever it reads, take this first left turn from off the A29. Follow this country road all the way up to Ewhurst Green, easily identifiable from the big green on the right with a cricket square in the middle. Continue on until arriving at a T junction on a bend. The pub where we will be eating later (The Bull's Head at Ewhurst) is off to the right, but turn left at this junction and follow the road until you come to a road leading off to the right signposted Shere & Albury. Turn right, keep going and Cranleigh G.C. will appear on your right.

For those travelling from the north, from Shalford (south of Guildford) take the B2128 down through Wonersh & Shamley Green. Look for a small turn off to the left called Smithwood Common Road and go down this until it joins up with Amlets Lane on the left. Go up Amlets Lane and at the T junction turn left and Cranleigh G.C. is immediately on your right.
