Despite repeated forecasts of showers, rain and even heavy thunderstorms, our mid-Summer's golf outing to Foxbridge took place in glorious weather, with everyone sitting outside soaking up the sunshine before the evening meal.

The day attracted 30 Wayfairers and 2 guests and this was the annual "Day of the Draws", as playing partners were drawn to join up and do battle for the Two Ronnies Trophy, and later in the day just which Wayfairer had drawn which player in the forthcoming Turnberry Open was revealed. And who were the winners? One winner was certainly the Course as it swallowed up a total of 79 balls with most of these ending up in a watery grave! Despite this the average score for the day was 29 (28.7) which is higher than of late.

The partnership of Dennis Shelley & Alan Rose very narrowly, by just one point, edged out the dynamic duo of Mike Colenutt & David Williams, to take home the much coveted Two Ronnies Trophy. Their final score was an excellent 47pts.

Mike Colenutt had an outstanding round. In the competition for The Wayfairers Trophy he was the clear winner by an almost obscene 5 pts, coming home with a score of 43! (His handicap will be hung, drawn & quartered! Ed) In second place with 38pts was Dennis "Why Am I Always The Bridesmaid"? Shelley. Poor Dennis! This is now his 5th second place, and as a founder member in 1995 he, like our beloved Secretary, has never won the Wayfairers Trophy in 14 years of trying!

The Course was in very good condition and the welcome, service and standard of food provided by the Club staff was excellent. A big welcome was extended to Stuart Saunders on his first official outing as a Wayfairer and also to David Rose. Both had endured forced extended absences from all the action, and it was great to see them back again.

Finally we must mention Jeff Hogg. Jeff had undergone a double bypass operation just days before Foxbridge, and everyone signed a "get well" card which he has since received. Despite this he has demanded a special mention in the Wayfairer. So here it is! Hi Jeff!

Our next meeting is our well publicized Charity Day, when we bring our fund raising for MacMillan Cancer Relief, which started back in September, to its conclusion.

As regards the golf there are lots of competitions and trophies to be won and the prize table should be one of our biggest of the year. It is the day of our annual Team Competition in which the victorious playing group will walk away with the President's Trophy, donated several years ago by Bernard McDonnell before his sad demise in 2005. There will be 4 Teams, captained by members of the Committee, these Teams being The Treasurer's, The Secretary's, The Match Coordinator's & The President's (which we will ask our auditor Peter Rushton to captain if Barry is still not fit enough to play). Playing groups will be announced a few days in advance. Current holders of the Trophy are the Treasurer's Team. All members of the winning Team will receive a Wayfairers golf ball - and warning! - all members of the 3 losing Teams will have to put £1 in the charity pot! Something to really play for! I don't want to lose that £1! Prizes will be aplenty as the top 2 scorers in each Team will all receive a prize. LATEST CHARITY FUND NEWS! 79 BALLS LOST AT FOXBRIDGE BOOSTS OUR CHARITY FUND RAISING!

A fun fund raising competition at Foxbridge was to guess the total number of balls lost by our 32 players. Guesses ranged from 19 to 85! Only 2 players never lost a ball - Spencer Atwell & Brian Girling, and 8 players lost 4 or more! Everyone paid £1 to have a go and £10 was presented to the player with the most accurate guess. The result was extremely close. One really pessimistic forecast of 85 to be lost was given by Spencer Atwell - and this was nearly correct! An amazing 79 were abandoned, and just 4 away from this total was Chris Wilkes with a prediction of 75. And so Chris went home richer by £10, with the balance of the money taken going into the Charity Fund.

An extremely generous donation of £20 to add to this was given by Bill Eslor who is unable to be with us at our July meeting. Thank you Bill. Sorry you can't defend your hedgehog at Hoebridge!

CASUAL DAY AT VILLA - FRIDAY 21st AUGUST

Currently we have 24 players for this day but with room for more members and guests. Villa is out in the sticks near Blackham, about 3 miles further along the A264 from Holtye in the direction of Tunbridge Wells. It is a very pleasant and completely rural 9 hole Course, with the only building in sight being an ancient oast house. Coffee is booked for 9am. with a 9.30 start for the golf. The Club does not have full catering facilities, so after play it's off to The "Hare & Hounds" at Bidborough for a 2 Course meal with coffee, arranged for around 5pm. The pub is about a 12 minute drive away, going through the lovely village of Penshurst on real country lanes. Full and exact directions will be given nearer the time.

Total cost for the day is just £23 to include all this plus prizes. A £5 deposit is payable now (or if preferable the full £23). Cheques to J.McDonnell or cash. Any outstanding balance is payable by the end of July.

This is our Age Related Day. The Individual Competition is based on 5 different Age groups - the Under 65's, 65 to 69, 70 to 74, 75 to 79 and the Over 80's, with 2 prizes up for grabs in each section. Age groups will be split among the actual playing groups, so there will be Team prizes as well as the usual other minor competitions.

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes
