## LIZ COLENUTT WAS THE CHAMP ON OUR CHARITY DAY AS THE SECRETARY'S TEAM SHOWED THE OTHERS THE WAY!

Monday 20th July was the big awaited day, bringing several months of minor charity fund raising to a grand finale at Hoebridge G.C. Full and further details regarding what happened and how much was raised, appear later in this edition, as we start as always with the golf report.

This was the day of the annual Team Golf Challenge for the President's Trophy with all players split into 4 separate teams - Treasurer's, Match Co-ordinator's, Secretary's & President's. Thanks to 2 very late entry guests, Jan & Martin Pye, the 4 Teams eventually ended up numerically equal, with 10 players in each Team.

The weather prior to the event had been dismal, wet and windy with unseasonable low temperatures. As always the Wayfairers changed all this, and the day was sunny and warm. No wet stuff arrived until later that night when all were safely back home!

Prizes were to be had for the best 2 scores in each Team, and although the Course was tricky it was in excellent condition, with an average score of 28 being recorded. Top player of the day and winner of the Wayfairers Trophy was Liz Colenutt who recorded an unbeatable total of 37pts, just edging Kevin Stacev into 2nd place by 1pt.

Captain of the day was husband Mike who won the trophy at our last meeting, and he had the privilege of presenting the award to Liz along with a couple of very affectionate kisses! (Disgusting! Should be reported to the R &A! Ed)

And what about the Team Competition? As the early scores came in it was nip & tuck, with the Treasurer's Team out in front and the Secretary's trailing last. Then the Secretary's middle batting order came good. Messrs. Goman & Stacey, together with the irrepressible Colenutts added 137pts between the 4 of them! This shot the Secretary's Selection into the lead, which they maintained to win by 7pts.

Celebrations were in order as every player in the Team was presented with a winners sticker and a Wayfairers ball. For the 30 players in losing Teams however, it was £1 a head in the charity pot! In the Clubhouse following the meal there was a tremendous atmosphere as the prize giving, the charity raffle and the auction seemed to go on forever, as more and more money swelled the funds.

#### Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer. Any queries regarding handicaps please refer to John Bateson (01342 832602).

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes
