AND SO TO OUR NEXT MEETING TO BE HELD AT CLANDON REGIS GC. ON FRIDAY 23rd OCTOBER 2009

We look forward to a full turn out of members for our 14th Annual General Meeting to be held at Clandon Regis Golf Club. This will be our second visit to this venue which was much acclaimed by all those who played here for the first time last year.

The telephone number is 01438 223992. The post code for use of Sat Nav. is GU4 7TT. The Clubhouse is on the north side of dual carriageway A246 which is the road running from Leatherhead through East Horsley towards Guildford. The A246 merges into the A25 just past the Golf Course. Please note that you cannot turn right from the south side of the carriageway into the entrance because there is a central reservation. Carry on to the A25 junction and return up the north side of the A246.

Last year detailed instructions of how to reach our destination were published, but in retrospect it seems that all drivers did "their own thing"! Some came from Leatherhead. Others travelled on the M25 and then came down the A3 turning off left at the Burnham & Merrow signpost above Guildford. Following another route, some approached on the A25. Please take whichever way you fancy, the important thing being that you are there promptly for 9am. LEAVE EARLY AS THE ROADS IN THIS AREA ARE EXTREMELY BUSY AT THIS TIME!

Coffee will be available from 9am. with the AGM starting punctually at 09.10. A maximum of 50 minutes will be allowed for the meeting with any unfinished business to be discussed after the evening meal. The first group out are due to tee off at 10.15. Early starters please have everything ready prior to the AGM. In order to occupy those who will have a long wait before playing we will as usual hold the Annual Team Putting Competition at this time. Early starters can play after completion of their 18 holes, but please don't be late for the meal even though we will have sufficient daylight, as the clocks do not go back until 48 hours later. A two Course meal with coffee is booked for 5.15pm.

The main prize of the day will be the Ron Harris Autumn Cup (current holder Tony Roche) with the winner also taking the Wayfairers Trophy (present custodian Robert Crompton). This is also the day of the year that the identity of the new Society Champion is revealed (won last year by John Bateson) and the Top Lady of the year will receive the latest Society trophy, which Jan Henshaw has temporarily claimed from last year's results. In addition, reviving an old tradition which fell by the wayside in 2008, the winners of the Pairs Knock Out Competition will be announced.

COST £35 This covers coffee on arrival, 18 holes, a 2 Course Meal with coffee and all prizes. RETURNS OF A TOTAL OF £45 A HEAD TO TONY PLEASE BY FRIDAY 9th OCTOBER OR JUST £10 IF YOU ARE REJOINING BUT CANNOT ATTEND THE AGM DAY. NOTE NO RETURN BY THE DEADLINE DATE AND IT WILL BE ASSUMED THAT YOU DO NOT WISH TO REJOIN. As we anticipate a very full turn out, it may not be possible to include guests on this occasion, but for the moment follow the usual procedure. Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer. Any queries regarding handicaps please refer to John Bateson (01342 832602).

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes
