With all the players in, and the cards having been thoroughly checked, the winners of the Two Ronnies Trophy were announced as Roger and Jeff (43pts) having just made it into top place by one point. This result was a double for Roger as it was the second year in succession that he had won the Trophy - last year partnered with Carl. Well done Roger! Next time your partnership will be in great demand!

This is the day of our annual Team Challenge Competition at the end of which the victorious playing group will walk away with the President's Trophy, first played for eleven years ago when it was presented by the then President Bernard McDonnell. There will as ever be 4 teams, these being The Treasurer's, the Secretary's, (current Trophy holders), the Match Co-ordinator's and the President's - with the latter probably captained by our auditor Peter Rushton. Playing groups will be announced a few days in advance. All members of the winning team will receive a Wayfairers golf ball, but WARNING! all members of the 3 losing teams will be asked to put £1 in the charity pot! Something to play for! Prizes will be plenty as the top 2 scorers in each team will all receive a prize. 

Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer. Any queries regarding handicaps please refer to John Bateson (01342 832602).

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will <u>definitely</u> result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin. Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes.
