### FOR NORMAN AT FOXBRIDGE A MOST MEMORABLE DAY T'WAS HIS BIRTHDAY AND PRIZES KEPT COMING HIS WAY!

The Wayfairers Annual Two Ronnies Day at Foxbridge saw a reduced number of members turn out, but for those who were present what a glorious June day, the weather was simply superb and absolutely perfect for playing golf.

The results however didn't quite match up to this statement! Foxbridge had changed! Nine extra new tee positions had been introduced, adding more variety in distance and direction and this together with some heavy rough plus speedy greens, took its toll on all the players.

Around an extra 250 yards had been added to the length of the Course and although this did add to the difficulty, the real problem became decision making on several of the unfamiliar and carefully positioned new tees. The full effect can be seen in the final results. Last year the average score by the Wayfairers was 29. This year that figure dropped to a very lowly 22.

One man mastered most of these problems however and this was our current Society Champion Norman. He had a field day and a birthday all combined!

His score of 32pts was the best of the day by a margin of 4pts! (How cut up he will be!) This easily won him the Wayfairers Trophy. His partner in the Two Ronnies was that well known bandit John Cunnington and between them they mustered a total of 36 pts to take the trophy by 2pts from the runners up. It is interesting to note that on the old lay out, the winning pair last year recorded 43pts. Seven more.

By winning both of these trophies Birthday Boy Norman was also inundated with countless prizes of bottles of wine but it still didn't end there! This was the day of the "Guess The Number of Balls Lost in the Water" and lucky Norman was spot on with his educated estimate of 33. This appropriately enough won him a box of a dozen Lake Balls. What a birthday!

Feel sorry for Dennis! He is the only original member of our Society who has never won the Wayfairers Trophy. For 17 years he has been trying and frequently, as on this occasion. he has finished 2nd - runner up but not a winner Your time will come Dennis. Just ask John McD. It took him 16 years!

Before dinner the results of the "Open Draw" were announced (see page 4) and following an excellent meal and the usual hilarious prize giving, a perfect Summer's day came to a close. And England beat Ukraine later! What a perfect conclusion!

### AND SO TO OUR NEXT MEETING -

### TO BE HELD AT SUTTON GREEN ON TUESDAY 24th JULY 2012

Our next gathering is our eagerly awaited first time visit to Sutton Green - the day when both our Treasurer and the Raffle subsidise our members on what we hope will be a day to remember! First where is it?! For those with Sat Nav the post code is GU4 7QF. For those who need directions head down the A3 towards Guildford from Junction 10 on the M25. At the Burpham and Merrow junction turn off to the left (this is before Guildford). Then it's straight over first mini roundabout and right at next roundabout towards Jacobs Well. Straight on at the next roundabout going back over the A3 towards Jacobs Well. This is Clay Lane. Go up Clay Lane until you come to a cross roads with Blanchards Hill to the right. Follow this until you come to a "Y" junction and turn right into Sutton Green Road. On the left is New Lane and in New Lane is Sutton Green Golf Club. Course length is 5897 yards - just shorter than Clandon by 20 yards so not excessively long.

Our subsidised day coincides with the day that we play for the President's Trophy with all players in one of 4 teams - the Treasurer's, the President's, the Secretary's or the Match Co-ordinator's. Playing groups will be announced a few days in advance.

All members of the winning team will receive a Wayfairers ball each, but take <u>WARNING!</u> All players in the 3 losing teams will be required to put £1 in the charity pot! The Secretary's Team has now won this Trophy on the last 3 occasions. It hasn't cost them a penny! The big question is can any other team do anything about this!?

Together with the Wayfairers Trophy (present holder "Storming" Norman) and the other minor competitions, the lower handicap players will do battle for the Jeff Hogg 18 & Under Trophy (current holder - Peter Rushton). As top lady golfer Laura Davies lives locally and designed the Course layout, whoever wins it will have deserved it!

Timing for the day. Coffee & Bacon Rolls from 09.15. First playing group out at 10am. Following the golf there will be a 3 Course Meal to be served at approx. 5pm.

AND THE PRICE? The true cost without the addition of any prizes is £50 a head. Thanks to the good housekeeping of our Treasurer and your support for the raffle, the subsidised cost for all members is just £33. With prizes included this is a £20 subsidy! Payment please to Tony by MONDAY 9th JULY.

Should you wish to bring a playing guest the cost is the full Sutton Green charge of £50 and availability for guests will not be known until after the 9th July.

#### Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer. Any queries regarding handicaps please refer to John Bateson (01342 832602).

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will <u>definitely</u> result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes.
