Conditions for playing were perfect but lightning fast greens, allied with some extremely tricky contours, made scoring very difficult for the majority of the 24 members and 8 guests taking part. This was reflected in an average score of just 24 with several of our very able golfers not even reaching a 20pts total.

In contrast the winner of the Wayfairers Trophy, coming in with an excellent total of 37pts, was Ken "Superman" Cooper, who just squeezed guest Neville Harrison into 2nd place on count back. Not content with this, 79 year old Ken by adding his age to his score arrived at an incredible total of 116 to win the "50 Bob Set" - this being our competition where age is added to Stableford points. Also our Hassocks meeting is the one at which Harold's Trophy is contested - nearest the pin in 3 on the 18th. Just like Ken the victor was not satisfied with one success, the winner being Bob Histed, who was also closest to the pin on the 17th, thus gaining him both the traditional beer and pint pot as well as Harold's mounted club head.

And what about the all important Pink Ball Team Competition? Just 2 playing groups out of the 8 competing managed to retain their ball to complete the full 18 holes without saying goodbye to it. The winning Team by a clear 7pts was the deadly combination of Jeff Hogg, Damon Pritchard, Bob Histed & John Cunnington and in so doing this they managed an excellent total of 33pts.

AND SO TO OUR NEXT MEETING - OUR AGM MEETING TO BE HELD AT CLANDON REGIS G.C. ON FRIDAY 19th OCTOBER

We look forward to a full turn out of members for our 17th Annual General Meeting to be held at Clandon Regis Golf Club. This will be our 5th visit to this very popular venue and delightful Golf Course. The telephone number is 01438 223992 and the post code for Sat Nav. is GU4 7TT.

For all those travelling from east to west along the M25, which probably is the vast majority, the most popular and trouble free route is as follows - Come off the M25 at Junction 10 and head south down the A3. After a short distance turn off at the sign post to Ripley. Go round and back under the A3 and turn off left into Ripley. Drive through Ripley and continue until you come to the junction with the A247 - Old Woking to the right & West Clandon to the left. Turn left and drive through West Clandon. Keep going until you come to a major cross roads junction. Turn left and you are on the A246 dual carriageway heading towards East Horsley & Leatherhead. After a short distance Clandon Regis G.C. will appear on your left.

PLEASE LEAVE EARLY AS ROADS IN THIS AREA ARE EXTREMELY BUSY AT THIS TIME AND WE NEED EVERYONE PRESENT FOR COFFEE AT 9am.

The AGM will start promptly at 09.20 and a maximum of 50 minutes allowed for the meeting with any unfinished business to be discussed after the evening meal. The first group out are due to tee off at 10.30. Early starters are requested to have everything ready to play prior to the AGM. In order to occupy those who will have a long wait before playing we will hold the Annual Team Putting Competition at this time. Early starters can play on completion of their 18 holes, but please don't be late for the meal which is booked for 5.30pm. This is a Two Course Meal with coffee.

The main prize of the day will be the Ron Harris Autumn Cup (held by Kevin Stacey) with the winner also taking the Wayfairers Trophy (holder Ken Cooper). This is also the occasion that the identities of the Society Champion and Ladies Champion are revealed and the winners of the KO Pairs Competition will receive their prizes and accolades, bringing another Wayfairer's year to its conclusion.

COST £35 This covers coffee on arrival, 18 holes, a 2 Course Meal with coffee and all prizes. (Same price as last 3 years and an excellent bargain as the normal 18 hole green fee is usually more than this.) Last year due to an administrative error no coffee was served with the evening meal so consequently this year there will be complimentary coffee served at the halfway point on the Course.

RETURNS OF A TOTAL £45 A HEAD TO TONY PLEASE BY FRIDAY 28th SEPTEMBER OR JUST £10 IF YOUR ARE REJOINING BUT CANNOT ATTEND THE AGM. NOTE NO RETURN BY THE DEADLINE DATE AND IT WILL BE ASSUMED THAT YOU DO NOT WISH TO REJOIN.

As a full turn out is anticipated, it may not be possible to include guests, but for the moment follow the usual procedure. Guests, if present, may attend the AGM but have no voting powers.

Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer. Any queries regarding handicaps please refer to John Bateson (01342 832602).

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will <u>definitely</u> result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes.
