Andy Knight wishes to thank all the Wayfairers who generously sponsored him in undertaking his first parachute jump, the Money raised going to the Breast Cancer Research fund. When the big day came Andy had to be at the airfield near Salisbury for 7.30am. An early start to a very long day. He and fellow volunteers then experienced an intensive 8 hour training session from members of the Parachute Regiment and, a physical and theoretical examination which he passed with flying colours and then "Ready to go!" After a very long and anxious wait he was told at 20.30 that the cloud had lifted sufficiently to go ahead. Very soon he was up at 7,000 feet and by his own admission "Never been so terrified in my whole life!" but his training stood him in good stead, and after taking the plunge downwards at an initial 120 mph, his chute opened for a more gradual 4 minute descent, This venture has benefited his chosen charity by some £1500, with payments still to be made. His comment on landing."I'm not going to waste all that training! I shall return!" Well done Andy. If only your putts drop as well as you did!

Our next meeting is our long anticipated Charity Day, when John B. will hope to add a few more final pounds to our coffers before sending off a cheque to St. Catherine's Hospice. 
