## NO SPRINGTIME AT GATTON - 'TWAS A DULL AND DAMP DAY BUT THE SUN SHONE FOR BILL ESLOR AS HE SHOWED THE WAY!

Gatton Manor was the venue for our Spring Cup meeting, but Spring certainly wasn't in the air what was however was a miserable cold persistent drizzle! This together with a Course that was surprisingly wet, heavy and extremely soggy under foot made scoring very difficult.

Suffice it to say that out of a field of 36 players (30 members and 6 guests) the top score was only 32pts, this being recorded by Bill Eslor who edged out into second place our Match Co-ordinator John B. who came in with 30. In previous years these scores would have gained very little, if anything, but it just shows how results can be affected by conditions. The average score for the day was a low 23pts.

Bill's efforts gained him the John Peake Spring Cup and also the Wayfairers Trophy but he will pay the penalty! Despite his low winning score, he will be severely cut as on our last outing - a casual gathering at Foxbridge - Bill won yet again! Two victories in two outings! You should be ashamed of yourself Bill! All this will be taken into account and used against you!

Hole 18 saw the challenge for Harold's Special Trophy - nearest the pin in 3 and this contest resulted in an unforeseen complicated situation. Derek was first to put his name on the marker albeit a long way from the hole. Guest Kam was next - on the green in two! - and a good putt left his 3rd shot less than a couple of feet from the pin. However this brilliant effort was narrowly beaten by yet another guest, Malcolm's son Richard. Our rules state that a guest cannot win a trophy on which winners' names are engraved, so Richard, although taking the prize, could not claim the trophy. Neither could 2nd placed Kam as he also was a guest. Despite Derek's name on the marker, many other Wayfairers had been closer than he was, but with no record of who actually was the closest, the trophy could not be awarded. Not all is lost however. We will play for it again at Ifield on their par 5 18th - not too long so the prize is there for any one to take! Sorry - but guests will not be eligible to compete!

Although the atmosphere out on the Course was rather damp and dull this was not reflected in the Clubhouse afterwards, as the drinks flowed together with much animated conversation. Many thanks to our new octogenarian David Rose who provided wine for the meal, this being followed as ever by a prize giving that seemed endless as there was so much to give away.

### AND SO TO OUR NEXT MEETING - THE BIG ONE - 100 UP! TO BE HELD AT IFIELD G.C ON MONDAY 24th MAY 2010

Our next meeting is an historic one as it marks the Wayfairers 100th official gathering, with this calculation not taking into account any "casual days" or golf played on any Society residential trips abroad or at home.

As this is a special day which has been publicised for some considerable time, we are hoping for a big turn out. There will be lots of "extras" with the cost to members being heavily subsidised.

Ifield is a new venue for the Wayfairers. Geographically it is ideally situated and is a traditional well established Members' Golf Club, which opened in 1927 with an 18 hole Parkland Course measuring some 6,300 yards. A few years ago this was a much sought after venue for Pro/Celebrity days, attracting the likes of Harry Secombe, Eric Sykes & Jimmy Tarbuck etc. together with many of the golfing stars of the day. Catering is provided by La Farola so Holtye members will feel very much at home.

As we are expecting full support, and as hopefully in late May, with plenty of daylight we could get some Summer weather, this will not be a rushed day. Coffee & Bacon Rolls will be provided from 09.30 with the first players going out at 10.30. Following the golf a 3 Course Meal will be served with coffee and wine provided on the tables. Meal guests will be most welcome, so why not invite your "other half" for aperitifs, the meal and the presentation ceremony? They can even buy a raffle ticket if they so wish!





#### Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer. Any queries regarding handicaps please refer to John Bateson (01342 832602).

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicapstrokes to be taken at the appropriate stroke index holes.
