AND SO TO OUR NEXT MEETING TO BE HELD AT FOXBRIDGE ON TUESDAY 22nd JUNE 2010

This is the day of the Annual Drawn Pairs Competition playing for the Two Ronnies Trophy. As it is so close to Mid-Summer's Day with hours of daylight available to us, we start a little bit later than usual, but on this occasion not quite so late as in previous years.

The first group out are due to tee off at 11am. but please aim to arrive at least an hour before this as we plan to make the draw for playing order & playing partners at 10.20am. Coffee & Bacon Rolls will be available as from 10am. and this is part of the package for which you are paying.

Knowing your Secretary this is not the only thing that you will have to pay for! If willing to take part, you will need to have on arrival £3 in coins handy! £2 of this will go to you drawing 2 players for the forthcoming Open Championship to be played at St. Andrews beginning on Thursday 15th July. Valuable prizes to go to those who draw the top 4 finishers! This draw replaces the raffle and the winners will receive their prizes and glory at our Cottesmore meeting - Monday 26th July.

So what is the other £1 for? Being Foxbridge you've guessed it, and its guessing that you've got to do! What is the total number of balls that will be lost in the water by all the players over the 18 holes? Could it be more than last year's amazing total of 79 balls?!! The Wayfairer who makes the closest prediction will win £10 (or this money will be split if more than one player makes a winning guess). Well what about the golf you ask? As well as playing for the Two Ronnies Pairs Trophy (current holders Dennis & Alan) there will be the usual Individual Wayfairers Stableford Competition with the Wayfairers Trophy (now in the safe keeping of Val Ward) up for grabs.

A 2 Course Evening Meal is booked for approx. 5pm. and as this is Foxbridge where changing facilities are extremely limited, there is no requirement on this occasion to change after playing. Please note however that this is the only venue that we visit for a "main day" where we relax this tradition.

Guests are most likely to be extremely welcome but payment for them cannot be accepted until our final numbers are verified on the last day for our members to apply - and this is Friday 11th June. Any guests playing will as far as possible be drawn with other guests to form a pair and should a "guest pair" finish in top place they will take all the relevant prizes, but not the Trophy, which will go to the best scoring Wayfairers duo.

Justification for handicap changes can thus clearly be seen based on the average score of 27.7



Rules.

Any handicap adjustments are to be made as the Competition proceeds. Current Wayfairers Handicaps at the time of playing will be on the website and in the latest editions of the Wayfairer. Any queries regarding handicaps please refer to John Bateson (01342 832602).

The competitions are to be played at a <u>mutually agreed</u> venue on a match play basis. Where one or more players are members of the chosen club all Green Fees are equally divided. Failure to meet any deadline will result in the Match Co-ordinator deciding the winners by the toss of a coin.

Ladies to play off ladies tees and play to ladies card and stroke index. On completion of each match the winning team are requested to notify the result promptly to John Bateson who, when he knows, will inform them who their opponents are in the next round. Also the current situation will be constantly updated on the website.

HANDICAPPING - a reminder. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch and the other players receives strokes on the basis of 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap - strokes to be taken at the
