NEW VENUE FOR OUR AGM DAY


As can be seen from the calendar above, we have moved our AGM venue from Clandon Regis to Bletchingley where we are getting a very similarly bargain priced deal as at Clandon. This is not a completely new venue for the Wayfairers, as we have played there several times before, the last occasion being in 2002. For many years this was the regular venue for our annual Christmas meeting.

Our Society now has several members who require buggies and as Clandon only has one, we had to turn away 2 of our players who wished to attend for the recent AGM meeting and the golf. Bletchingley is well provided with buggies and they have also made arrangements so that we can split our numbers and tee off simultaneously on the 1st & 10th, thus doing away with the necessity for a "time filling" putting competition.

A GOOD IDEA FOR OUR CHARITY FROM CARL

Carl has offered a suggestion that could increase our Charity fund total when we visit Coulsdon in March. £1 will be collected from each player and everyone must record how many putts they take on each green The player who takes the fewest in total will walk away with a nice prize and all the profit left from the income will go to our charity. For any hole in which a ball has to be picked up early because the player has run out of shots, the score will count as a 3 putt. Once on the green players must putt out regardless of how many points they have on that particular hole.

As ever our Charity total will be boosted also with £30 from the day's raffle takings.
