Dear Member / Prospective Member,

REPORT ON THE MEETING AT CHIDDINGFOLD GOLF CLUB ON 17th NOVEMBER 1995 AND OFFICIAL FORMATION OF THE ABOVE SOCIETY.

Sixteen players, many of whom are now fully paid up Way-Fairers, attended the inaugural meeting at Chiddingfold where the sun shone on the righteous and a good day's golf was enjoyed.

The Competition results and a financial report on the day are included as an annex to this report.

It was decided that a Society should be formed, open to all, to be known as THE WAY - FAIRERS GOLFING SOCIETY and that there should be an initial joining fee of £5 to meet running expenses and the purchase of a suitable trophy.

It was agreed that the aim should be to arrange between 4 to 6 Meetings a year with a current cost target not to exceed £25 for any Winter golf packages. A variety of Courses and costs was to be the objective with an over-riding aim of value for money.

A Handicap Committee consisting of Ron Harris, John Bateson & John McDonnell should review handicaps after each event, and Society handicaps assessed on the basis of Society performance and known abilities should operate (i.e. these may differ from official Club handicaps).

The Next Proposed Meeting

This hopefully will be held on <u>WEDNESDAY 28th FEBRUARY</u> at Slinfold Park Golf Club situated on the A29 just south of where the A29 meets the A281, north of Billingshurst. We have chosen this Course because of the excellent value of the offer but there are some disadvantages as detailed further below - however let's start with the good factors!

1. Value £15 for 18 holes followed by a choice of one FREE course from the Bar Menu. A copy of the Bar menu is enclosed. Please choose one main dish from the list and put on the return slip if you decide to play on this day. The normal cost for a weekday round is £20 so the bargain we are getting is obvious. This special offer that we are taking up ceases at the end of February.

If you do wish to play please note that we meet up in the Bar FROM 9.45 am. ONWARDS with the first tee booking made FOR 10.30 am.

Note We will in fact charge a total of £17 for the day to include £2 a head for prizes as this is not a "Bring & Win" Event. Slinfold also require a non-returnable deposit of £10.

- 2 The Course Although we haven't played the Course it looks to be in very good condition, having been closed for only one day throughout this Winter. The day we visited was after eavy prolonged rain and all the normal tees and greens were in play.

AND NOW TO OUR NEXT MEETING

This is to be held on FRIDAY 17th MAY at Shillinglee Park Golf Club which is situated not very far from Chiddingfold G.C. where the majority of Wayfairers have played previously. An easy way to find Shillinglee is to drive south down the A283 passing Chiddingfold G.C. on your left. Continue over the County boundary from Surrey into Sussex until you find yourself approaching a crossroads at which Shillinglee G.C. is signposted to your left. Down this road you will find the Course about a mile along on your left. An alternative route for those travelling from the east is to turn off the A281 (Horsham / Guildford road) at Bucks Green, and follow signs to Loxwood - and from Loxwood on to Plaistow. In Plaistow turn right and further on left to Shillinglee (signposted at this junction). Allow a full hour from the East Grinstead area as it is easy to get lost!

Shillinglee Golf Club is designed and owned by PGA Professional Roger Mace who is well known for his Golf Show (clinic and trick shots demonstration). At one time in his Club professional days he had Ian Woosnam and Barry Lane working for him as his Assistants.

Shillinglee is a 9 hole Course, not particularly long, (par 64) with lots of tricky par 3's, and the accent is on playing for position on this Course rather than trying to hit the ball out of sight! (Nick "Animal" Widdowson beware!) Because it is not long we are planning a 27 Hole day, plus a Pitch & Putt Team Competition round a rather unusual little 6 hole course. Approx Timings - 09.00 Arrive Coffee & Danish Pastry

- 09.30 A 9 Hole Texas Scramble Begins Teams of 3 very different and great fun!

What constitutes a guest?

Some members have queried how a guest is different from a member particularly if a member can bring a guest to several different meetings. Basically there are 4 differences.

2). A guest may win a minor prize, but cannot win The Wayfairers Trophy, or any other of our major Trophies which involve engraving of names.

 Should there be any restriction on numbers at any of our meetings, guests would only be able to take any vacant places left after all Wayfairers had opportunity to meet deadline dates for availability.

4). Guests may attend our AGM and enter discussions but have no voting powers.
