OUR NEXT MEETING IS AT AT WELLSHURST GOLF CLUB ON MONDAY 30th MAY

This is our first visit to Wellshurst which is nicely situated for our members living in the Uckfield or Crowborough areas. It is at Hellingly on the A267 north of Hailsham. Despite the Course being tree lined throughout and tight and tricky in places, it is not long measuring 5372 yards for the men and just 4778 for the ladies. Plenty of bunkers so pack those sand irons! Being situated on the edge of the South Downs one or two holes are a bit of a climb but none of these are very long. No oxygen required but a buggy might be helpful. For Sat Nav. the post code is BN27 4ED and the Course is in North Street Hellingly.

This is the day our playing groups compete together as a team to play for the dreaded Pink Ball Trophy and as always the individual winner of the day will take the Wayfairers Trophy. In addition we will be holding the usual Nearest the Pin and two Longest Drive Contests.
