This was the day when players competed for the 50 Bob Set where age is added to score. The winner was Trevor Bacon with a total of 117. His score was 32 so guess what his age is! Following the golf and a most convivial refreshments break an excellent 2 Course Meal was served to be followed by the raffle and belated presentation of prizes to the 3 winners of our recent Open Draw. ## AND SO TO OUR NEXT MEETING TO BE HELD AT VILLA G. C. ON MONDAY 17th OCTOBER

Villa is a hardy annual visit for the Wayfairers so it is assumed everyone is familiar with the location. It is not a long course with just 9 holes but set in the most beautiful countryside. On arrival coffee will be served with the golf due to commence at 9.30am. Villa only has 5 buggies and we have reserved all of these which hopefully will be sufficient. Many members who will require one have advised me of this already. Please add your name to the list if appropriate.

Over 18 holes members will be playing for the Wayfairers Shield to be presented together with the Ron Harris Autumn Cup and there will be a playing group team competition, the usual nearest the pin and longest drive contests and bringing back just for this one meeting as there are 8 par 3 holes, a competition for the Par 3 Challenge Plaque. Also on Hole 18 members will compete for Harold's 18th Hole Award with the winner being the player nearest to the pin in 3 shots on the 314 yard last hole. Should more than one player actually hole out in 3 shots on this hole - which is quite a possibility - the award will go to the player who has scored best over the whole 18 holes.

Following the golf with no hot meal catering facilities at Villa it's all off on a 10 minute drive to the Kentish Horse at Markbeech where in a private room a 2 Course Meal consisting of ham, egg & chips followed by cherry pie & cream or ice cream will be served, This will be followed by the traditional prize giving for the day's golf.

No raffle on this occasion but on arrival at Villa members will be requested to part with £2 to take part in a guessing competition related to the day's golf results and after deduction of prize money all profit will go to our charity fund.

The total cost for the day to include arrival coffee, 18 holes, the 2 course meal and all prizes is a very reasonable £40.

After cost of all the prizes has been deducted (just over £90) then £30 will go into our Charity Fund with the remainder staying in the Raffle Fund. Our current stock of Wayfairers Golf balls is now depleting and the time is approaching when they will need renewing and this expenditure comes from our raffle money.

### **OUR CHARITY**

Just a reminder that following a ballot among our members just over a year ago the majority voted to fund raise for Jig Saw (South East) which is a charity giving information, advice and guidance to support bereaved children and young people facing the death of a loved one.

To date - including the £30 above from Ifield - we have raised just over £400 with this money coming in from donations, the Raffle, the Open Draw & various little fun golf related competitions. The next one of these is at Villa (see page 2).

Since 2006 when at an AGM it was agreed that our Society should be more "outward looking" as well as self centred, money has been raised for 7 different charities with new recipients being agreed by vote as soon as any fund raising has ended by a cheque being presented to a grateful organisation.
