Daylight dawned on Monday 17th October, the day the Wayfairers were due to play at Villa - and what a dawn it was! Not much daylight but literally buckets and buckets of rain were falling. It was absolutely pouring down giving the immediate impression that the whole day was likely to be a complete washout.

However at leaving home time the constant downpour ceased and although it turned out to be a rather dull cloudy start the initial group of players were on the first tee for 09.30 exactly as planned. Then gradually as the day progressed the clouds lifted and it was not long before members were enjoying an extremely pleasant Autumn day on a really pretty 9 hole course. A total of 23 members and one welcome guest all went out in an attempt to gain glory but only one truly succeeded and this was Mick Shiel. This winning total gave both the Wayfairers Shield and the Ron Harris Autumn Cup to Mick so he had good reason to celebrate particularly as this was the day before his 75th birthday! Well done Mick - a most memorable occasion and many thanks to you for putting wine on the meal table so that all present could share in your celebrations.

Obviously with all the initial heavy rain the course was wet but nevertheless proved to be extremely playable and as they came in many members were full of praise for the excellent condition. Well done Villa - no wonder we keep returning year after year. One thing that was different this year however was the chosen venue for much needed sustenance and refreshment after the 18 holes. Unfortunately Villa has very limited catering facilities so it's always a case of finding somewhere suitable afterwards to eat, socialise and present the day's awards. Just 10 minutes drive away is the Kentish Horse and going there all were made most welcome with a generously proportioned meal of ham, egg & chips followed by cherry pie & cream/custard. With members all seated around one long table an excellent atmosphere was created as the ambiance flowed together with Mick's wine and all the usual craic and banter.

A pleasantly noisy prize giving followed the meal with birthday boy Mick the star of the show as he duly celebrated his three quarters of a century. AND SO OUR CHRISTMAS MEETING AT HOLTYE G.C. ON FRIDAY 9th DECEMBER

With so many of our members requiring buggies and with their availability very unlikely in December our traditional Christmas Texas Scramble is as last year reduced to 9 holes. The reason that this has been done is because some of our buggy users have advised that although they might be able to walk 9 holes they cannot manage the full 18 - particularly holes 6 & 7 for a second time! As a consequence to this the start time is put back as previous to 11.30 with coffee available on arrival.

Incorporated into the Scramble will be the ever popular 2 Longest Drives plus the Nearest the Pin contests. Traditionally at Christmas, as part of all the usual seasonal fun, we hold the Shortest Drive Competition which originally covered shots taken from the 10th tee. However as we are only playing 9 this contest is now on the first tee! Just think! - if you hit a duffer you could win an unwanted prize with your very first shot of the day! - and also lose your dignity! A very sleepless night beckons! Repeated as ever will be the competition to win the Christmas Tankard complete with a strong liquid to put in it. The winner is the player who is in the eventual winning Scramble Team and is the one to sink the final winning putt on the last green. The Christmas Tankard is one of our oldest awards going right back to 1996. Originally it went to the top performing player of the day but as the event is now a Scramble there is no one individual winner. We do however have a most appropriate Team Scramble trophy which will be up for grabs. Following the golf at approx. 3pm a 2 Course Christmas meal with tea or coffee will be served to be followed by some frantic festive frolics!

<u>"GIMMES</u> Several years ago following discussion it was agreed at one of our AGM's that the concept of allowing "gimmes" to other players should cease. This of course is when a ball seems so close to a hole that the player due to putt it is allowed to pick it up without playing.

We have all in our time seen ridiculously short putts missed and it was felt that with trophies and other prizes at stake, all putts should be sunk. There can be no arguments then. By imposing this rule it also did away with any doubts of whether or not a member of the playing group should be granted this concession making some members feel they were being unreasonable or mean if they didn't do so.

Hopefully everyone appreciates the reasoning behind this decision so please no more gimmes from now on. Those tiddly putts can be missed as we know to our cost and it's all part of the game to make sure they aren't missed and successfully disappear downwards!"

HANDICAP CHANGES REMEMBER! Any player scoring more than 5 above the average score for the day is liable to be cut. Any player scoring more than 3 below the average is likely to receive shots back. Average at Villa was 27. Maximum handicap allowance 36.
